.6	Section 1. [137.345] SUSTAINABLE MINING INSTITUTE.
.7	Subdivision 1. Establishment; mission. (a) A Sustainable Mining Institute is
.8	established at the University of Minnesota, Duluth. The mission of the institute is to
.9	conduct and facilitate research into, and implementation of, sustainable mining practices,
.10	with emphasis on sustainable mining practices that would benefit both the operation of
.11	proposed and existing mines within the state, and the communities and economies within
.12	close proximity of the mines.
.13	(b) The institute's primary classroom facilities must be located within 15 miles
.14	of an existing, operational mine.
.15	Subd. 2. Advisory board. (a) The work of the Institute must be guided by a
.16	nine-member advisory board appointed by the chancellor of the University of Minnesota,
