1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 256B.0943, subdivision 7, is amended to
1.7	read:
1.8	Subd. 7. Qualifications of individual and team providers. (a) An individual
1.9	or team provider working within the scope of the provider's practice or qualifications
1.10	may provide service components of children's therapeutic services and supports that are
1.11	identified as medically necessary in a client's individual treatment plan.
1.12	(b) An individual provider must be qualified as:
1.13	(1) a mental health professional as defined in subdivision 1, paragraph (n); or
1.14	(2) a mental health practitioner as defined in section 245.4871, subdivision 26. The
1.15	mental health practitioner must work under the clinical supervision of a mental health
1.16	professional; or
1.17	(3) a mental health behavioral aide working under the clinical supervision of a
1.18	mental health professional to implement the rehabilitative mental health services identified
1.19	in the client's individual treatment plan and individual behavior plan.
1.20	(A) A level I mental health behavioral aide must:
1.21	(i) be at least 18 years old;
1.22	(ii) have a high school diploma or general equivalency diploma (GED) or two years
1.23	of experience as a primary caregiver to a child with severe emotional disturbance within
1.24	the previous ten years; and

2.2	(B) A level II mental health behavioral aide must:
2.3	(i) be at least 18 years old;
2.4	(ii) have an associate or bachelor's degree or 4,000 hours of experience in delivering

2.6	complete a certificate program established under subdivision 8a; and
2.7	(iii) meet preservice and continuing education requirements in subdivision 8.
2.8	(c) A preschool program multidisciplinary team must include at least one mental
2.9	health professional and one or more of the following individuals under the clinical
2.10	supervision of a mental health professional:
2.11	(i) a mental health practitioner; or
2.12	(ii) a program person, including a teacher, assistant teacher, or aide, who meets the
2.13	qualifications and training standards of a level I mental health behavioral aide.
2.14	(d) A day treatment multidisciplinary team must include at least one mental health
2.15	professional and one mental health practitioner.

2.20	Universities, shall develop a certificate program of not fewer than 11 credits for level II
2.21	mental health behavioral aides. The program shall include classroom and field-based
2.22	learning. The program components must include, but not be limited to, mental illnesses
2.23	in children, parent and family perspectives, skill training, documentation and reporting,
