1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2021 Supplement, section 15.01, is amended to read:

1.10	The following agencies are designated as the departments of the state government: the

Subdivision 1. Applicability. This section applies to the following departments or 2.3 agencies: the Departments of Administration, Agriculture, Behavioral Health, Commerce, 2.4 Corrections, Education, Employment and Economic Development, Health, Human Rights, 2.5 Labor and Industry, Management and Budget, Natural Resources, Public Safety, Human 2.6 Services, Revenue, Transportation, and Veterans Affairs; the Housing Finance and Pollution 2.7 Control Agencies; the Office of Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation; 2.8 the Department of Information Technology Services; the Bureau of Mediation Services; 2.9 and their successor departments and agencies. The heads of the foregoing departments or 2.10 agencies are "commissioners." 2.11

Subd. 2. **Group I salary limits.** The salary for a position listed in this subdivision shall not exceed 133 percent of the salary of the governor. This limit must be adjusted annually on January 1. The new limit must equal the limit for the prior year increased by the percentage increase, if any, in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers from October of the second prior year to October of the immediately prior year. The commissioner of management and budget must publish the limit on the department's website. This subdivision applies to the following positions:
