BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA: 13 1.4 Section 1. APPROPRIATIONS. The sums shown in the columns marked "Appropriations" are added to the 1.5 appropriations in Laws 2013, chapter 117, article 1, unless otherwise specified, to the 1.6 agencies and for the purposes specified in this article. Unless otherwise specified, the 1.7 appropriations are not added to the base appropriation for each purpose. The appropriations 1.8 are from the general fund, or another named fund, and are available for the fiscal years 1.9 indicated for each purpose.
