1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. [260C.81] CHILD WELFARE EVALUATION.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Child welfare workforce stability study. (a) The commissioner of
1.8	human services shall partner with the University of Minnesota's Center for Advanced Studies
1.9	in Child Welfare to conduct a child welfare workforce stability study. The first study must
1.10	be completed by June 30, 2020, and the study must be repeated biennially thereafter. The
1.11	study must examine (1) workforce intent to remain in child welfare, (2) statewide rates of
1.12	turnover, and (3) barriers to retention.
1.13	(b) The commissioner shall report the results of each child welfare workforce stability
1.14	study to the governor and to the committees in the house of representatives and senate with
1.15	jurisdiction over human services by December 1, 2020, and biennially thereafter.
1.16	(c) After each child welfare workforce stability study is complete, the commissioner
1.17	shall work with the Child Welfare Training Academy, counties, tribes, and other stakeholders
1.18	to develop strategies to stabilize the workforce as appropriate.
1.19	(d) Appropriations for this subdivision are available in either year of the biennium.
