1.1	A bill for an act
1.2	relating to state government; requiring the commissioner of management and
1.3	budget to implement a program to obtain discounted prescription drugs through
1.4	Canadian pharmacies; establishing a Web site for ordering prescription drugs;
1.5	providing state and local employee health plans, state health care programs, and
1.6	health plan companies access to discounted prescription drugs; proposing coding
1.7	for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 151.
1.8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.9	Section 1. [151.75] PRESCRIPTION DRUG REIMPORTATION PROGRAM.
1.10	Subdivision 1. Establishment. The commissioner of management and budget shall
1.11	develop a program to make discounted prescription drugs reimported from Canada available
1.12	to Minnesotans. The commissioner shall implement the program by July 1, 2019.
1.13	Subd. 2. Price negotiation; contracts. (a) The commissioner of management and budget
1.14	shall negotiate prescription drug prices with Canadian pharmacies licensed under section
1.15	151.19, subdivision 1, and shall contract with the pharmacies to make these prices available
1.16	to eligible entities. The commissioner shall require pharmacies, as a condition of contract,
1.17	to verify:
1.18	(1) the business location;
1.19	(2) licensure by a Canadian province;
1.20	(3) that licensed pharmacists are filling prescriptions; and
1.21	(4) that prescription drugs being delivered are supplied by the pharmacy.
1.22	(b) The commissioner of management and budget shall exclude from the reimportation
1.23	program those prescription drugs for which:

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2.1	(1) the commissioner has determined that significant savings, relative to prices paid by
2.2	Minnesota purchasers, cannot be obtained after accounting for administrative and shipping
2.3	<u>costs;</u>
2.4	(2) the commissioner has quality concerns, including concerns related to preserving drug
2.5	quality throughout the mail-order delivery process; or
2.6	(3) approval has not been received from the United States Food and Drug Administration.
2.7	(c) In setting the price of a prescription drug for purchase on the program Web site, the
2.8	commissioner of management and budget may add an assessment sufficient to cover the
2.9	costs to the agency of administering the program and to pay back the agency for start-up
2.10	expenses over a six-year period, not to exceed \$ per prescription. Contracts with
2.11	Canadian pharmacies must require the pharmacy to pay to the commissioner, on a monthly
2.12	basis, an amount equal to the total amount of the assessment fees collected by the pharmacy
2.13	through orders using the program's Web site.
2.14	(d) The commissioner of management and budget may enter into an agreement with a
2.15	pharmacy benefit manager to negotiate prices and administer contracts with Canadian
2.16	pharmacies.
2.17	Subd. 3. Eligible entities. The following entities are eligible to purchase prescription
2.18	drugs under the program:
2.19	(1) state and local government employee health care programs established under sections
2.20	43A.23 and 43A.316;
2.21	(2) state health care programs administered by the commissioner of human services
2.22	under chapters 256B and 256L; and
2.23	(3) health plan companies as defined under section 62Q.01, subdivision 4.
2.24	Subd. 4. Web site. The commissioner of management and budget shall establish a Web
2.25	site, or modify an existing Web site, to allow eligible entities to purchase prescription drugs
2.26	from Canadian pharmacies at the price negotiated by the commissioner, plus any assessment
2.27	for agency administrative costs. The Web site must allow enrollees of eligible entities to
2.28	have prescription drugs delivered to a participating Minnesota pharmacy.
2.29	Subd. 5. Participating pharmacies; administrative and counseling fee. A Minnesota
2.30	pharmacy may register with the commissioner and the Board of Pharmacy to participate in
2.31	the program. A participating pharmacy must receive and store prescription drugs delivered
2.32	by Canadian pharmacies, notify enrollees of the arrival of the prescription drugs, and provide
2.33	drug counseling at the time a prescription drug is dispensed. A participating pharmacy may
