Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 171.13, is amended by adding a subdivision 1.6 to read: 1.7 Subd. 10. Written examination plain language requirements. (a) For purposes of this 1.8 subdivision, the following terms have the meanings given: 1.9 (1) "committee" means the Department of Public Safety, Division of Driver and Vehicle 1.10 Services Test Maintenance Committee responsible for monitoring, reviewing, and editing 1.11 the written portion of the driver's knowledge examination on behalf of the Division of Driver 1.12 and Vehicle Services; 1.13 (2) "plain language standards" means the requirements specified in paragraph (b) and 1.14 the requirements of the Plain Writing Act, Public Law 111-274, and governor's Executive 1.15 Order 14-07; and 1.16 (3) "written examination" means the written portion of the driver's knowledge examination 1.17 in English and administered under this section. 1.18 (b) By February 1, 2025, the commissioner must implement plain language standards 1.19 and create a new written portion of the knowledge examination to ensure the written 1.20 examination is a fair assessment of the state's traffic and driving laws. The new written 1.21 portion of the knowledge examination, to the extent practicable, must be organized to serve

3.1	(d) The committee must convene its first meeting by August 1, 2024. Before publication
3.2	of the new written examination under plain language requirements, the committee must
3.3	meet at least four times before January 1, 2025. The commissioner of public safety may

3.9	By February 1, 2026, the commissioner must submit a report to the chairs, ranking
3.10	minority members, and legislative staff including but not limited to counsel, fiscal analyst,
3.11	committee assistant, caucus research, and legislative assistants of the chairs and ranking
3.12	minority members of the committees having jurisdiction over transportation finance and
3.13	policy. The report must detail the implementation of plain language standards for the written
3.14	portion of the driver's knowledge examination required under Minnesota Statutes, section
3.15	171.13, subdivision 10, and include:
3.16	(1) a comprehensive analysis on the new written portion of the driver's knowledge
3.17	examination compared to its offerings in languages other than English;
3.18	(2) a report on the committee's consideration, adoption, and implementation of plain

3.20	(3) whether the Division of Driver and Vehicle Services anticipates hiring and staffing
3.21	issues related to the implementation of plain language standards for future written
3.22	examinations;
3.23	(4) total expenditures on implementation of plain language standards;
3.24	(5) any recommended additions or modifications to the plain language standards to
3.25	improve reader comprehension; and
3.26	(6) feedback from driver's education programs, employees who administer written
3.27	examinations, the public, and English as a second language professionals.

3.29	(a) \$212,000 in fiscal year 2025 is appropriated from the driver and vehicle services
3.30	operating account in the special revenue fund to the commissioner of public safety for costs
3.31	related to: (1) rewriting the written portion of the driver's knowledge examination with the

1.4	(b) The commissioner of public safety may use the funds appropriated under this section
1.5	to enter into an agreement with a third party to participate in revisions to meet the plain
1.6	language requirements under Minnesota Statutes, section 171.13, subdivision 10, and to
1 7	provide plain language analysis of materials provided and offered to the public as part of a

driver's license application and driver education, including the driver's manual.
