1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 340A.301, subdivision 6, is amended to

1.7 Subd. 6. **Fees.** The annual fees for licenses under this section are as follows:

1.8	(a) Manufacturers (except as provided in clauses (b)	30,000
1.9	and (c))	\$ <u>350</u>
1.10	Duplicates	\$ 3,000
1.11	(b) Manufacturers of wines of not more than 25 percent	
1.12	alcohol by volume	\$ 500
1.13	(c) Brewers who manufacture more than 3,500 barrels	
1.14	of malt liquor in a year	\$ 4,000
1.15	(d) Brewers who also hold one or more retail on-sale	
1.16	licenses and who manufacture fewer than 3,500	
1.17	barrels of malt liquor in a year, at any one licensed	
1.18	premises, the entire production of which is solely for	
1.19	consumption on tap on any licensed premises owned	
1.20	by the brewer, or for off-sale from those licensed	
1.21	premises as permitted in subdivision 7. A brewer	
1.22	licensed under this clause must obtain a separate	
1.23	license for each licensed premises where the brewer	
1.24	brews malt liquor. A brewer licensed under this	
1.25	clause may not be licensed as an importer under this

1.27	(e) Wholesalers (except as provided in clauses (f), (g),	
1.28	and (h))	\$ 15,000
1.29	Duplicates	\$ 3,000
1.30	(f) Wholesalers of wines of not more than 25 percent

2.8 If a business licensed under this section is destroyed, or damaged to the extent that
2.9 it cannot be carried on, or if it ceases because of the death or illness of the licensee, the
2.10 commissioner may refund the license fee for the balance of the license period to the
2.11 licensee or to the licensee's estate.
