1.10	program must include a matching grant component. A county, home rule charter or

1.12	subdivision of the state authorized by law to enter contracts is eligible for a matching grant					
1.13	under the program. Activities eligible for partial reimbursement with state money include					
1.14	sanitation, including removal of infested trees and stumps; protection of ash trees using					
1.15	lowest risk treatments; and other integrated pest management and suppression activities
