1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 150A.06, subdivision 1a, is amended to read:
1.8	Subd. 1a. Faculty dentists. (a) Faculty members of a school of dentistry must be licensed
1.9	in order to practice dentistry as defined in section 150A.05. The board may issue to members
1.10	of the faculty of a school of dentistry a license designated as either a "limited faculty license"
1.11	or a "full faculty license" entitling the holder to practice dentistry within the terms described
1.12	in paragraph (b) or (c). The dean of a school of dentistry and program directors of a
1.13	Minnesota dental hygiene, dental therapy, or dental assisting school accredited by the
1.14	Commission on Dental Accreditation shall certify to the board those members of the school's
1.15	faculty who practice dentistry but are not licensed to practice dentistry in Minnesota. A
1.16	faculty member who practices dentistry as defined in section 150A.05, before beginning
1.17	duties in a school of dentistry or a, dental therapy, dental hygiene, or dental assisting school,
1.18	shall apply to the board for a limited or full faculty license. Pursuant to Minnesota Rules,
1.19	chapter 3100, and at the discretion of the board, a limited faculty license must be renewed
1.20	annually and a full faculty license must be renewed biennially. The faculty applicant shall
1.21	pay a nonrefundable fee set by the board for issuing and renewing the faculty license. The
1.22	faculty license is valid during the time the holder remains a member of the faculty of a
1.23	school of dentistry or a, dental therapy, dental hygiene, or dental assisting school and subjects
1.24	the holder to this chapter.

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(b) The board may issue to dentist members of the faculty of a Minnesota school of
dentistry, <u>dental therapy</u>, dental hygiene, or dental assisting accredited by the Commission
on Dental Accreditation, a license designated as a limited faculty license entitling the holder
to practice dentistry within the school and its affiliated teaching facilities, but only for the
purposes of teaching or conducting research. The practice of dentistry at a school facility
for purposes other than teaching or research is not allowed unless the dentist was a faculty
member on August 1, 1993.

2.8 (c) The board may issue to dentist members of the faculty of a Minnesota school of dentistry, dental therapy, dental hygiene, or dental assisting accredited by the Commission 2.9 on Dental Accreditation a license designated as a full faculty license entitling the holder to 2.10 practice dentistry within the school and its affiliated teaching facilities and elsewhere if the 2.11 holder of the license is employed 50 percent time or more full time by the school in the 2.12 practice of teaching, supervising, or research, and upon successful review by the board of 2.13 the applicant's qualifications as described in subdivisions 1, 1c, and 4 and board rule. The 2.14 board, at its discretion, may waive specific licensing prerequisites. 2.15

- 2.18 Subd. 10. Emeritus inactive license. (a) A dental professional licensed under this chapter

active practice in the state may apply to the board for an emeritus inactive license. An

2.21 applicant must apply for an emeritus inactive license on the biennial licensing form or by
2.22 petitioning the board.

2.23 (b) The board shall not grant an emeritus inactive license to an applicant who is the

2.24 subject of a disciplinary action resulting in the current suspension, revocation,

- 2.25 disqualification, condition, or restriction of the applicant's license to practice dentistry,
- 2.26 <u>dental therapy, dental hygiene, or dental assisting.</u>
- 2.27 (c) An emeritus inactive licensee is prohibited from practicing dentistry, dental therapy,
   2.28 dental hygiene, or dental assisting. An emeritus inactive license is a formal recognition of
   2.29 completion of the licensee's dental career in good standing.
- 2.30 (d) The board shall charge a onetime fee for issuance of an emeritus inactive license,
  2.31 pursuant to section 150A.091.

- 4.7 (2) for an emeritus active license in dental therapy, \$100;
