1.7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 45.25, is amended by adding a subdivision
1.9	to read:
1.10	Subd. 8a. Live course. "Live course" means any learning experience that is actively led
1.11	by an instructor, either online or in a classroom setting, that offers person-to-person, real-time
1.12	feedback. A live course offered online must:
1.13	(1) specify the minimum system requirements;
1.14	(2) provide encryption that ensures that all personal information, including the student's
1.15	name, address, and credit card number, cannot be read as it passes across the Internet;
1.16	(3) include technology to guarantee seat time;
1.17	(4) include the ability for the student to get technical support within a reasonable amount
1.18	of time;
1.19	(5) include a statement that the student's information will not be sold or distributed to
1.20	any third party without the prior written consent of the student. Taking the course does not
1.21	constitute consent; and

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(3) supervising and evaluating courses and instructors. Supervision includes assuring,
especially when a course will be taught by more than one instructor, that all areas of the
curriculum are addressed without redundancy and that continuity is present throughout the
entire course;

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5.5 (4) ensuring that instructors are qualified to teach the course offering;

5.6 (5) furnishing the commissioner, upon request, with copies of course and instructor
5.7 evaluations and qualifications of instructors. Evaluations must be completed by students
5.8 and coordinators;

5.9 (6) investigating complaints related to course offerings and instructors and forwarding
5.10 a copy of the written complaints to the Department of Commerce;

(7) maintaining accurate records relating to course offerings, instructors, tests taken by 5.11 students, and student attendance for a period of three years from the date on which the 5.12 course was completed. These records must be made available to the commissioner upon 5.13 request. In the event that an education provider ceases operation for any reason, the 5.14 coordinator is responsible for maintaining the records or providing a custodian for the 5.15 records acceptable to the commissioner. The coordinator must notify the commissioner of 5.16 the name and address of that person. In order to be acceptable to the commissioner, custodians 5.17 must agree to make copies of acknowledgments available to students at a reasonable fee. 5.18 Under no circumstances will the commissioner act as custodian of the records; 5.19

(8) ensuring that the coordinator is available to instructors and students throughout course
offerings and providing to the students and instructor the name of the coordinator and a
telephone number at which the coordinator can be reached;

(10) providing course completion certificates within ten days of, but not before,
completion of the entire course. Course completion certificates must be completed in their
entirety. It is not necessary to provide a written course completion certificate if the course
completion certificate has been electronically delivered to the department or its designated
licensing contractor. A coordinator may require payment of the course tuition as a condition
for receiving the course completion certificate;

APPENDIX Repealed Minnesota Statutes: S3288-1

45.25 DEFINITIONS.

Subd. 2a. **Classroom course.** "Classroom course" means an educational process based on live or real-time instruction including, but not limited to:

(1) a course in which there is no geographic separation of instructor and learner;

(2) a course taught live that is concurrently simulcast to remote locations and where each location is monitored by a proctor; and

(3) a course taught live that is concurrently simulcast to individual students online and that includes a process to authenticate the student's identity and technology to guarantee seat time.

Subd. 14. **Self-study course.** "Self-study course" means a distance learning course that is not entirely taught by the instructor live via the Internet, video, or other electronic means.
