1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 624.712, is amended by adding a subdivision
1.8	to read:
1.9	Subd. 13. Large-capacity magazine. "Large-capacity magazine" means any ammunition
1.10	feeding device with the capacity to accept more than ten rounds, or any conversion kit, part,
1.11	or combination of parts from which this type of device can be assembled if those parts are
1.12	in the possession or under the control of the same person. The term does not include any of
1.13	the following:
1.14	(1) a feeding device that has been permanently altered so that it cannot accommodate
1.15	more than ten rounds;
1.16	(2) a .22 caliber tube ammunition feeding device; or
1.17	(3) a tubular magazine that is contained in a lever-action firearm.
1.18	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective August 1, 2018, and applies to crimes
