- Subd. 12. Greater Minnesota. "Greater Minnesota" means the area of the state outside 2.2 the nine-county ten-county metropolitan area served by the first phase. 2.3
- Sec. 5. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 403.36, subdivision 1, is amended to read: 2.4
- Subdivision 1. Membership. (a) The commissioner of public safety shall convene and 2.5 chair the Statewide Radio Board to develop a project plan for a statewide, shared, trunked 2.6 public safety radio communication system. The system may be referred to as "Allied Radio Matrix for Emergency Response," or "ARMER." 2.8
- (b) The board consists of the following members or their designees: 2.9
- (1) the commissioner of public safety; 2.10

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- (2) the commissioner of transportation; 2.11
- (3) the state chief information officer; 2.12
- (4) the commissioner of natural resources; 2.13
- (5) the chief of the Minnesota State Patrol; 2.14

 - (9) two sheriffs, one from the nine-county ten-county metropolitan area and one from Greater Minnesota, appointed by the governing body of the Minnesota Sheriffs' Association;
- (10) two chiefs of police, one from the nine-county ten-county metropolitan area and 2.24 one from Greater Minnesota, appointed by the governor after considering recommendations 2.25 made by the Minnesota Chiefs' of Police Association; 2.26
- 2.27 (11) two fire chiefs, one from the nine-county ten-county metropolitan area and one from Greater Minnesota, appointed by the governor after considering recommendations 2.28 made by the Minnesota Fire Chiefs' Association; 2.29

Sec. 5. 2 (12) two representatives of emergency medical service providers, one from the nine-county ten-county metropolitan area and one from Greater Minnesota, appointed by the governor after considering recommendations made by the Minnesota Ambulance Association;

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(13) the chair of the regional radio board for the metropolitan area Metropolitan Emergency Services Board; and

- (14) a representative of Greater Minnesota elected by those units of government in phase three and any subsequent phase of development as defined in the statewide, shared radio and communication plan, who have submitted a plan to the Statewide Radio Board and where development has been initiated.
- (c) The Statewide Radio Board shall coordinate the appointment of board members representing Greater Minnesota with the appointing authorities and may designate the geographic region or regions from which an appointed board member is selected where necessary to provide representation from throughout the state.
