OFFICIAL STATUS

A bill for an act 1.1 relating to transportation; modifying application procedures and requirements for 1.2 driver's license; creating driving privilege license and setting fee for issuance; 13 amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 171.01, subdivisions 37, 49a, by adding 1.4 a subdivision; Minnesota Statutes 2017 Supplement, sections 171.06, subdivisions 1.5 1, 2, 3; 171.07, subdivision 1. 1.6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA: 1.7 1.8 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 171.01, is amended by adding a subdivision to read: 1.9 1.10 Subd. 31c. Driving privilege license. "Driving privilege license" means a class D license, instruction permit, or provisional license to operate a motor vehicle issued or issuable under 1.11 the laws of this state by the commissioner of public safety to a person who is unable to 1.12 demonstrate legal presence in this country through current lawful admission status, permanent 1.13 resident status, indefinite authorized presence status, or United States citizenship. A driving 1.14 privilege license may be used only for driving and not as identification or proof of legal 1.15 presence or citizenship. A driving privilege license must not be used or accepted for voter 1.16 registration purposes under section 201.061. All provisions in this chapter relating to drivers' 1.17 licenses, instruction permits, and provisional licenses, including cancellation, suspension, 1 18 revocation, reinstatement, examination, restriction, expiration, renewal, and unlawful acts 1.19 and violations, apply to a driving privilege license. 1.20

3.45 In addition to each fee required in this paragraph, the commissioner shall collect a surcharge

3.46 of: (1) \$1.75 until June 30, 2012; and (2) \$1.00 from July 1, 2012, to June 30, 2016.

4.1 Surcharges collected under this paragraph must be credited to the driver and vehicle services
4.2 technology account in the special revenue fund under section 299A.705.

(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), an individual who holds a provisional license and
has a driving record free of (1) convictions for a violation of section 169A.20, 169A.33,
169A.35, sections 169A.50 to 169A.53, or section 171.177, (2) convictions for crash-related
moving violations, and (3) convictions for moving violations that are not crash related, shall
have a \$3.50 credit toward the fee for any classified under-21 driver's license. "Moving
violation" has the meaning given it in section 171.04, subdivision 1.

4.9 (c) In addition to the driver's license fee required under paragraph (a), the commissioner
4.10 shall collect an additional \$4 processing fee from each new applicant or individual renewing
4.11 a license with a school bus endorsement to cover the costs for processing an applicant's
4.12 initial and biennial physical examination certificate. The department shall not charge these
4.13 applicants any other fee to receive or renew the endorsement.

6.5	must have security features that make the document as impervious to alteration as is

Subdivision 1. License; contents and design. (a) Upon the payment of the required fee, 6.11 the department shall issue to every qualifying applicant a license designating the type or 6.12 class of vehicles the applicant is authorized to drive as applied for. This license must bear: 6.13 6.14 (1) a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee; (2) the licensee's full name and date of birth; (3) either (i) the licensee's residence address, or (ii) the designated address under 6.15 section 5B.05; (4) a description of the licensee in a manner as the commissioner deems 6.16 necessary; (5) the usual signature of the licensee; and (6) designations and markings as 6.17 provided in this section. No license is valid unless it bears the usual signature of the licensee. 6.18 Every license must bear a colored photograph or an electronically produced image of the 6.19 licensee. A driving privilege license must be plainly marked "FOR DRIVING ONLY." 6.20

(b) If the United States Postal Service will not deliver mail to the applicant's residence
address as listed on the license, then the applicant shall provide verification from the United
States Postal Service that mail will not be delivered to the applicant's residence address and
that mail will be delivered to a specified alternate mailing address. When an applicant
provides an alternate mailing address under this subdivision, the commissioner shall use
the alternate mailing address in lieu of the applicant's residence address for all notices and
mailings to the applicant.

6.28 (c) Every license issued to an applicant under the age of 21 must be of a distinguishing
6.29 color and plainly marked "Under-21."

6.30 (d) A license issued to an applicant age 65 or over must be plainly marked "senior" if6.31 requested by the applicant.

6.32 (e) Except for an enhanced driver's license or a noncompliant license, a license must6.33 bear a distinguishing indicator for compliance with requirements of the REAL ID Act.

- 7.1 (f) A noncompliant license must:
- 7.2 (1) be marked "not for federal identification" on the face and in the machine-readable7.3 portion; and
- 7.4 (2) have a unique design or color indicator.
- 7.5 (g) A license issued to a person with temporary lawful status must be marked "temporary"
  7.6 on the face and in the machine-readable portion.

(h) A license must display the licensee's full name or no fewer than 39 characters of the
name. Any necessary truncation must begin with the last character of the middle name and
proceed through the second letter of the middle name, followed by the last character of the
first name and proceeding through the second letter of the first name.

7.11 Sec. 8. ELECTION JUDGE TRAINING.

7.12 The secretary of state shall inform each county auditor that a driving privilege license

7.13 as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 171.01, subdivision 31c, must not be used or

7.14 accepted for voter registration purposes under Minnesota Statutes, section 201.061. Each

7.15 county auditor must inform all election officials and election judges hired for an election

7.16 that a driving privilege license must not be used or accepted for voter registration purposes

7.17 <u>under Minnesota Statutes, section 201.061</u>. County auditors and municipal clerks must

7.18 <u>include this information in all election judge training courses.</u>

- 7.20 Sections 1 to 8 are effective January 1, 2019, for a new driver's license, permit, or
- 7.21 identification card, and a renewal issued on or after that date.
