BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 609.561, is amended by adding a subdivision

to read:

Subd. 4. First degree; political organization. Whoever unlawfully by means of fire or

explosives intentionally destroys or damages any building, whether the property of the actor

or another, commits arson in the first degree and may be sentenced to imprisonment for not

more than 25 years or to a fine of not more than \$40,000, or both if:

(1) the building housed a political organization;

1.14

(2) the offense was committed in whole or in substantial part because of an actual or

1.15

perceived association between the building, building's owner, or building's occupant and

1.16

any political organization; or

1.17

(3) the offense was committed in whole or in substantial part to make any political

statement.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective August 1, 2024, and applies to crimes

committed on or after that date.

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 609.563, is amended by adding a subdivision to read:

Subd. 1a. **Political motivation.** Whoever violates subdivision 1 may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than 90 months or to payment of a fine of \$12,500, or both, if:

(1) the real or personal property is owned or controlled by a political organization;

(2) the offense was committed in whole or in substantial part because of an actual or perceived association between the real or personal property and any political organization;
or

(3) the offense was committed in whole or in substantial part to make any political statement.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective August 1, 2024, and applies to crimes committed on or after that date.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 609.5631, is amended by adding a subdivision to read:

Subd. 3. **Political motivation.** Whoever violates subdivision 2 may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than one year or to payment of a fine of \$5,000, or both, if:

(1) the personal property is owned or controlled by a political organization;

(2) the offense was committed in whole or in substantial part because of an actual or perceived association between the personal property and any political organization; or

(3) the offense was committed in whole or in substantial part to make any political statement.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective August 1, 2024, and applies to crimes committed on or after that date.

Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 609.5632, is amended to read:

609.5632 ARSON IN THE FIFTH DEGREE.

(a) Whoever intentionally by means of fire or explosives sets fire to or burns or causes to be burned any real or personal property of value is guilty of a misdemeanor and may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than 90 days or to payment of a fine of not more than \$1,000, or both.

3.1 (b) Whoever violates paragraph (a) may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than
3.2 364 days or to payment of a fine of \$3,000, or both, if:

3.3 (1) the real or personal property is owned or controlled by a political organization;

3.4 (2) the offense was committed in whole or in substantial part because of an actual or
3.5 perceived association between the real or personal property and any political organization;
3.6 or

3.7 (3) the offense was committed in whole or in substantial part to make any political
3.8 statement.

3.9 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective August 1, 2024, and applies to crimes
3.10 committed on or after that date.
