Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 123B.71, subdivision 11, is amended to read:

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Subd. 11. **Review of proposals.** In reviewing each proposal, the commissioner shall submit to the school board, within 60 days of receiving the proposal, the review and comment about the educational and economic advisability of the project. In the review and comment submitted to the school board, the commissioner must explain the reasons for the proposal's advisability. The commissioner must include a summary of the comments from residents of the school district in the review and comment. The review and comment shall be based on information submitted with the proposal and other information the commissioner determines is necessary. If the commissioner submits a negative review and comment for a portion of a proposal, the review and comment shall clearly specify which portion of the proposal received a negative review and comment and which portion of the proposal received a positive review and comment.
