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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. LEGISLATIVE EMPLOYEE WORKING GROUP ON THE

LEGISLATURE'S ACCESSIBILITY MEASURES.

<u>Subdivision 1.</u> <u>Membership.</u> The legislative employee working group on the legislature's accessibility measures consists of ten members. The senate majority leader and the speaker of the house must each appoint three employees from among the following offices that serve their respective bodies: media offices, information technology offices, legal and fiscal analysis offices, the secretary of the senate, the chief clerk of the house of representatives, and other offices considered appropriate. The chair of the Legislative Coordinating Commission must appoint four members from among the employees who serve in the Office of the Revisor of Statutes, the Legislative Reference Library, the Legislative Coordinating Commission, and the Office of the Legislative Auditor. In conducting its work, the working group may consult with the MN.IT Office of Accessibility; the Commission of Deaf, Deafblind, and Hard-of-Hearing Minnesotans; the Disability Agency Forum; and other groups that may be of assistance. Appointments to the working group must be made by June 1, 2018.

Subd. 2. **Duties**; report. The employee working group must submit a report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over rules and to the chair and vice-chair of the Legislative Coordinating Commission by December 15, 2018. The report must: (1) identify ways that the legislature's accessibility measures do
