- 1.2 relating to local government; amending the conditions for participation in an open
- 1.3 meeting from a nonpublic location; amending Minnesota Statutes 2021 Supplement,
- 1.4 section 13D.02, subdivision 1.
- 1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
- 1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2021 Supplement, section 13D.02, subdivision 1, is amended
- 1.7 to read:
- 1.8 Subdivision 1. **Conditions.** (a) A meeting governed by section 13D.01, subdivisions 1,
- 1.9 2, 4, and 5, and this section may be conducted by interactive technology so long as:
- 1.10 (1) all members of the body participating in the meeting, wherever their physical location,
- 1.11 can hear and see one another and can hear and see all discussion and testimony presented
- 1.12 at any location at which at least one member is present;
- 1.13 (2) members of the public present at the regular meeting location of the body can hear
- 1.14 and see all discussion and testimony and all votes of members of the body;
- 1.15 (3) at least one member of the body is physically present at the regular meeting location;
- 1.16 (4) all votes are conducted by roll call so each member's vote on each issue can be
- 1.17 identified and recorded; and
- 1.18 (5) each location at which a member of the body is present is open and accessible to the
- 1.19 public.
- 1.20 (b) A meeting satisfies the requirements of paragraph (a), although a member of the
- 1.21 public body participates from a location that is not open or accessible to the public, if the

2.1 member has not participated more than three times in a calendar year from a location that
2.2 is not open or accessible to the public, and:

2.3 (1) the member is serving in the military and is at a required drill, deployed, or on active
2.4 duty; or

2.5 (2) the member has been advised by a health care professional against being in a public
2.6 place for personal or family medical reasons. ~~This clause only applies when a state of
2.7 emergency has been declared under section 12.31, and expires 60 days after the removal of
2.8 the state of emergency.~~
