1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2023 Supplement, section 122A.77, subdivision 2, is

1.8 Subd. 2. **Grant uses.** (a) A grant recipient must use grant funds to support participants

1.9 who are employed by the grant recipient ~~as either a paraprofessional or other unlicensed~~

1.10 ~~staff, or a teacher with a Tier 1 or Tier 2 license,~~ and demonstrate a willingness to be a

1.11 special education teacher after completing the program.

1.12 (b) A grant recipient may use grant funds for:

1.13 (1) tuition assistance or stipends for participants;

1.14 (2) supports for participants, including mentoring, licensure test preparation, and

1.15 technology support; or

1.16 (3) participant recruitment.
