1.5	Section 1. TASK FORCE ON PREVENTING VIOLENCE AGAINST LATINA

1.7	Subdivision 1. Establishment; duties. (a) By August 1, 2024, the commissioner of
1.8	public safety shall establish a Task Force on Preventing Violence Against Latina Women.
1.9	The task force shall provide recommendations to reduce and end violence against Latina
1.10	women and girls in Minnesota; recommend strategies to disrupt the developmental pathways
1.11	toward gender-based violence; identify key strategies to help prevent abuse and violence
1.12	before it occurs, including outreach and communication to high-risk populations; and
1.13	recommend strategies to develop public engagement and prevention campaigns to address
