1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 197.79, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
1.7	Subdivision 1. Definitions. For purposes of this section, the following terms have the
1.8	meanings given them.
1.9	(a) "Applicant" means a veteran or a veteran's guardian, conservator, or personal
1.10	representative or a beneficiary or a beneficiary's guardian, conservator, or personal
1.11	representative who has filed an application with the commissioner for a bonus under this

1.13	(b) "Application" means a request for a bonus payment by a veteran, a veteran's

while on active duty, as determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.								
(k) (l) "Veteran" has the meaning given in section 197.447, and does not include a								
member of the National Guard or the reserve components of the United States armed forces								
ordered to active duty for the sole purpose of training. Veteran also includes:

A veteran, or the beneficiary of a veteran, entitled to a 4.14 bonus may make application for a bonus to the department on a form as prescribed by the 4.15 commissioner and verified by the applicant. If the veteran is incompetent incapacitated or 4.16 the veteran's beneficiary is a minor or incompetent incapacitated, the application must be 4.17 4.18 made by the person's guardian or conservator. An application must be accompanied by evidence of residency, honorable service, active duty service during the eligibility period 4.19 for the bonus, and any other information the commissioner requires. The applicant must 4.20 indicate on the application form the bonus amount for which the applicant expects to be 4.21 eligible. 4.22

If the information provided in the application is incomplete, the department must notify
the applicant in writing of that fact and must identify the items of information needed to
make a determination. After notifying an applicant that the person's application is incomplete,
the department shall hold the application open <u>for up to 120 days</u> while awaiting further
information from the applicant, and the applicant may submit that information <u>within the</u>
120-day period without filing an appeal and request for review.
