1.5BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 121A.2207, subdivision 1, is amended to

1.7read:

1.8Subdivision 1. **Districts and schools permitted to maintain supply.** (a) Notwithstanding

1.9section 151.37, districts and schools may obtain and possess epinephrine auto-injectors to

1.10be maintained and administered by school personnel to a student or other individual if, in

1.11good faith, it is determined that person is experiencing anaphylaxis regardless of whether

1.12the student or other individual has a prescription for an epinephrine auto-injector. The

1.13administration of an epinephrine auto-injector in accordance with this section is not the

1.14practice of medicine.

1.15(b) Registered nurses may administer epinephrine auto-injectors in a school setting

1.16according to a condition-specific protocol as authorized under section 148.235, subdivision

1.178. Notwithstanding any limitation in sections 148.171 to 148.285, licensed practical nurses

1.18may administer epinephrine auto-injectors in a school setting according to a condition-specific

1.19protocol that does not reference a specific patient and that specifies the circumstances under

1.20which the epinephrine auto-injector is to be administered, when caring for a patient whose

1.21condition falls within the protocol.

1.22**EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective July 1, 2024.
