1.10	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 354B.20, is amended by adding a subdivision

1.12	Subd. 10a. IRAP to TRA transfer account. "IRAP to TRA transfer account" means
1.13	the account established under section 354B.215, subdivision 11.
1.14	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective January 1, 2025.

1.17	Subd. 11a. Offset amount. "Offset amount" means the lesser of \$10,000 or 25 percent

3.19	(4) any other information that Minnesota State may require.
3.20	(b) No later than 60 days after receipt of the application under paragraph (a), Minnesota

3.22	whether the person is an eligible person under subdivision 3, and provide a written response
3.23	to the person regarding the determination of eligibility. If Minnesota State determines that

5.15	(d) Minnesota State must promptly initiate the transfer of funds or work with the eligible
5.16	person to initiate the transfer of funds to the Teachers Retirement Association from the
5.17	eligible person's account in the individual retirement account plan and, if directed by the
5.18	eligible person under paragraph (c), from any other account over which Minnesota State
5.19	has the authority to initiate or approve transfers when directed by a participant.
5.20	(e) Unless the balance in the IRAP to TRA transfer account is zero, Minnesota State
5.21	must direct a transfer to the Teachers Retirement Association of an amount that is equal to
5.22	the offset amount attributable to the eligible person. If the balance in the IRAP to TRA
5.23	transfer account is less than the amount needed to transfer the offset amount, Minnesota
5.24	State must direct a transfer of the remaining balance in the IRAP to TRA transfer account
5.25	to the Teachers Retirement Association.
5.26	Subd. 7. Commencement of membership in the Teachers Retirement Association. (a)
5.27	Upon receipt by the Teachers Retirement Association of the transfer or transfers under
5.28	subdivision 6, the eligible person's membership in the Teachers Retirement Association
5.29	commences effective as of the transfer date and the executive director must grant past service
5.30	credit to the eligible person.
5.31	(b) The executive director may adjust the amount of past service credit granted to the
5.32	eligible person as necessary to ensure that the Teachers Retirement Association does not
5.33	receive less than required to cover the cost of the past service credit granted.

6.1	(c) Upon membership commencement, the eligible person ceases to be an active
6.2	participant in the individual retirement account plan.
6.3	(d) Upon membership commencement, the person's membership status is irrevocable.
6.4	Neither Minnesota State nor the Teachers Retirement Association may seek to revoke the
6.5	eligible person's membership status due to events, including but not limited to Minnesota
6.6	State producing documentation that would have previously disqualified the person as an
6.7	eligible person under subdivision 3.
6.8	Subd. 8. Service credit for vesting. The Teachers Retirement Association must grant
6.9	service credit to the eligible person for all years or partial years of service with Minnesota
6.10	State for the purpose of vesting in a retirement annuity under section 354.44 or in a retirement
6.11	benefit under section 354.46 or 354.48.
6.12	Subd. 9. Notice to employees. No later than March 31, 2025, and periodically thereafter,
6.13	Minnesota State must provide notice to all employees summarizing this section and offer
6.14	assistance to any eligible person who wishes to elect to transfer coverage from the individual
6.15	retirement account plan to the Teachers Retirement Association. Minnesota State must
6.16	designate personnel responsible for assisting employees with the requirements of this section.
6.17	The notice must identify these personnel and provide their contact information.
6.18	Subd. 10. Annual report required. The chancellor and the executive director must
6.19	submit an annual report to the Legislative Commission on Pensions and Retirement stating
6.20	the number of employees who elected a transfer during the prior calendar year. Without
6.21	identifying any eligible person, the report must include, for each eligible person, the cost
6.22	of the transfer to the eligible persons and Minnesota State, the offset amount, if any, and,
6.23	if applicable, the actuarial cost of the eligible person's pension benefit at the time of the
6.24	transfer as calculated by the Teachers Retirement Association. The report must be submitted
6.25	to the Legislative Commission on Pensions and Retirement no later than January 31 of each
6.26	year.
6.27	Subd. 11. IRAP to TRA transfer account created. (a) The IRAP to TRA transfer
6.28	account is created in the special revenue fund.
6.29	(b) Minnesota State must use the money in the IRAP to TRA transfer account established
6.30	under paragraph (a) to transfer amounts required by subdivision 6, paragraph (e), until the
6.31	balance in the account is zero.
