1.6	Section 1. OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME LITERACY INSTRUCTION.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Establishment. A three-year pilot program is established to provide
1.8	evidence-based literacy instruction in out-of-school programs through nonprofit community
1.9	organizations and public libraries across the state.
1.10	Subd. 2. Cuant aligibility. A nonnefit community approximation on public library that
1.10	Subd. 2. Grant eligibility. A nonprofit community organization or public library that
1.11	provides after-school or out-of-school time programming to school-aged children may apply,
1.12	in the form and manner prescribed by the commissioner of education, for a grant to provide
1.13	evidence-based literacy instruction. Recipients may use grant funds to establish new
1.14	evidence-based literacy instruction programming, to expand current evidence-based literacy
1.15	instruction programming, and to ensure program staff obtain the knowledge and skills
1.16	necessary to provide evidence-based literacy instruction to school-aged children. The
1.17	commissioner must award up to 50 percent of the grant funds to nonprofit community
1.18	organizations or public libraries located in the city of Minneapolis and the remaining grant
1.19	funds must be awarded to eligible grant recipients in greater Minnesota.
1.20	Subd. 3. Report; evaluation. A grant recipient must report to the Department of
1.21	Education by December 15, 2025, and August 15, 2027, on the progress of their activities.
1.22	The report must include but is not limited to the number of children served by each program,
1.23	specific details of the evidence-based literacy programming, and the training provided to

determine the effect of the evidence-based literacy instruction provided under the pilot
