BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

## Section 1. [299A.375] ALTERNATIVE TO POLICE; PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY RESPONSE GRANT PROGRAM.

Subdivision 1. **Program established.** The commissioner of public safety shall make grants to cities or counties to create alternative public safety emergency response programs to respond to 911 calls and other situations that traditionally have resulted in a dispatch of peace officers. An eligible city or county shall detail to the commissioner a plan to create and staff such an office to replace the primary use of peace officers in a specified situation or situations with professionals appropriately trained to deal with the emergency. Examples of this include but are not limited to assigning mental health professionals to calls involving individuals experiencing a mental health crisis, chemical dependency or health care professionals to assist persons experiencing problems related to overdoses or substance abuse, and social workers to situations involving people experiencing homelessness. The alternative public safety emergency response professionals may call for the dispatch of peace officers if necessary to protect the safety of those involved.

Subd. 2. Local match. Funds transferred by a city or county from law enforcement services to a qualified alternative public safety emergency responder program shall qualify for matching funds from the grant program.
