Laws 2020, Fifth Special Session chapter 3, article 9, section 6

Sec. 6. STATE PATROL TROOPER SALARY INCREASE.

The commissioner of public safety must increase the salary paid to state patrol troopers by 8.4 percent.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.
