1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 624.714, subdivision 3, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 3. Form and contents of application. (a) Applications for permits to carry must
1.8	be an official, standardized application form, adopted under section 624.7151, and must set
1.9	forth in writing only the following information:
1.10	(1) the applicant's name, residence, telephone number, if any, and driver's license number
1.11	or state identification card number;
1.12	(2) the applicant's sex, date of birth, height, weight, and color of eyes and hair, and
1.13	distinguishing physical characteristics, if any;
1.14	(3) the township or statutory city or home rule charter city, and county, of all Minnesota
1.15	residences of the applicant in the last five years, though not including specific addresses;
1.16	(4) the township or city, county, and state of all non-Minnesota residences of the applicant
1.17	in the last five years, though not including specific addresses;
1.18	(5) a statement that the applicant authorizes the release to the sheriff of commitment
1.19	information about the applicant maintained by the commissioner of human services or any
1.20	similar agency or department of another state where the applicant has resided, to the extent
1.21	that the information relates to the applicant's eligibility to possess a firearm; and

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(i) Application forms must clearly display a notice that a permit, if granted, is void and
must be immediately returned to the sheriff if the permit holder is or becomes prohibited
by law from possessing a firearm. The notice must list the applicable state criminal offenses
and civil categories that prohibit a person from possessing a firearm.

3.5 (j) Upon receipt of an application packet and any required fee, the sheriff must provide
3.6 a signed receipt indicating the date of submission.

3.7 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 624.714, subdivision 4, is amended to read:

Subd. 4. Investigation. (a) The sheriff must check, by means of electronic data transfer, 3.8 criminal records, histories, and warrant information on each applicant through the Minnesota 3.9 Crime Information System and the National Instant Criminal Background Check System. 3.10 In addition, if the applicant is not a United States citizen, the sheriff must ensure that an 3.11 Immigration Alien Query (IAQ) check is performed on the applicant. The sheriff shall also 3.12 make a reasonable effort to check other available and relevant federal, state, or local 3.13 record-keeping systems. The sheriff must obtain commitment information from the 3.14 commissioner of human services as provided in section 245.041 or, if the information is 3.15 reasonably available, as provided by a similar statute from another state. 3.16

3.17 (b) When an application for a permit is filed under this section, the sheriff must notify
3.18 the chief of police, if any, of the municipality where the applicant resides. The police chief
3.19 may provide the sheriff with any information relevant to the issuance of the permit.

3.20 (c) The sheriff must conduct a background check by means of electronic data transfer
3.21 on a permit holder through the Minnesota Crime Information System and the National
3.22 Instant Criminal Background Check System at least yearly to ensure continuing eligibility.
3.23 The sheriff may also conduct additional background checks by means of electronic data
3.24 transfer on a permit holder at any time during the period that a permit is in effect.

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
