The Trade Policy Advisory Council is established 1.6 1.7 to advise and assist the governor and the legislature regarding government procurement agreements of United States trade agreements. 18 Subd. 2. Membership. (a) The Trade Policy Advisory Council shall have 14 19 members, as follows: 1 10 (1) the commissioner of employment and economic development or designee; 1 11 (2) the commissioner of agriculture or designee; 1.12 (3) two senators, including one appointed by the Subcommittee on Committees of the 1.13 Committee on Rules and Administration, and one appointed by the minority leader; and 1 14 (4) two members of the house of representatives, including one member appointed 1.15 by the speaker of the house and one member appointed by the minority leader; and 1 16 (5) eight members appointed by the governor.
