1.8	Subdivision 1. Purpose. The purpose of this section is to increase the number of heritage
1.9	language and culture teachers in Minnesota.
1.10	Subd. 2. Definitions. "Heritage language and culture teachers" means teachers with a
1.11	connection to a community's language and culture who use this connection to support
1.12	students as they learn academic content or the language and culture of that particular
1.13	community.
1.14	Subd. 3. Eligibility. Applicants for the heritage language and culture licensure pathway
1.15	program must:
1.16	(1) hold a current license issued by the Professional Educator Licensing and Standards
1.17	Board or meet the criteria for licensure in 122A.181; and
1.18	(2) seek initial, dual, or additional licensure in a heritage language.
