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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. [122A.76] DYSLEXIA TRAINING FOR TEACHERS.

Subdivision 1. **Program.** A teacher licensed by the Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board, whose duties include providing reading instruction to students, may participate in a dyslexia training program offered by an eligible training provider under subdivision 2. The commissioner may pay a portion of the tuition, room, board, and travel costs a teacher incurs in participating in dyslexia training. The teacher reimbursements must not exceed the amount appropriated for this purpose. In order to be eligible for expense reimbursement, a teacher must submit a request in the form and manner required by the commissioner.

- Subd. 2. **Eligible training providers.** An eligible dyslexia training provider must be:
- (1) a Wilson Language Training accredited partner;
- (2) accredited by the International Multisensory Structured Language Education Council;

- (3) an accredited site of the Academy of Orton-Gillingham Practitioners and Educators.
- Subd. 3. **Training information report.** By February 1 of each year, the commissioner
- must report the following information on dyslexia to the legislative committees having

jurisdiction over kindergarten through grade 12 education:
