## **169.475 USE OF WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS DEVICE.** 1.14

Subdivision 1. Definition. For purposes of this section, "electronic message" means a 1.15 self-contained piece of digital communication that is designed or intended to be transmitted 1.16 between physical devices. An electronic message includes, but is not limited to, e-mail, a 1.17 text message, an instant message, a command or request to access a World Wide Web page, 1.18 or other data that uses a commonly recognized electronic communications protocol. An 1.19 electronic message does not include voice or other data transmitted as a result of making a 1.20 phone call, or data transmitted automatically by a wireless communications device without 1.21 direct initiation by a person. 1.22
