 1.2 relating to capital investment; appropriating money for capital projects.

1.3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.4 Section 1. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT APPROPRIATIONS.

1.5 The sums shown in the column under "Appropriations" are appropriated from the
 1.6 general fund to the state agencies or officials indicated, to be spent for public purposes.
 1.7 Unless otherwise specified, the appropriations in this act are available until the project is
 1.8 completed or abandoned subject to Minnesota Statutes, section 16A.642.

 2.3 2013, chapter 136, section 3.

2.4 **Sec. 3. MINNESOTA AMATEUR SPORTS**

2.6 **Subdivision 1. Total Appropriation** **\$ 1,500,000**

2.7 To the Minnesota Amateur Sports
 2.8 Commission for the purposes specified in
 2.9 this section.

2.10 **Subd. 2. Mighty Ducks Ice Arena Renovations** **1,500,000**

2.11 For grants to local government units under
 2.12 Minnesota Statutes, section 240A.09,
 2.13 paragraph (g) or (k), or to acquire equipment
 2.14 to improve indoor air quality by reducing
 2.15 concentrations of carbon monoxide and
 2.16 nitrogen dioxide.

2.17 **Sec. 4. TRANSPORTATION**

2.18 **Subdivision 1. Total Appropriation** **\$ 69,500,000**

2.19 To the commissioner of transportation for the
 2.20 purposes specified in this section.

2.21 **Subd. 2. Local Bridge Replacement and**
 2.22 **Rehabilitation** **25,000,000**

2.23 To match federal money and to replace
 2.24 or rehabilitate local deficient bridges as
 2.25 provided in Minnesota Statutes, section
 2.26 174.50. To the extent practicable, the
 2.27 commissioner shall expend the funds as
 2.28 provided under Minnesota Statutes, section
 2.29 174.50, subdivision 6a, 6b, or 6c.

2.30 \$11,750,000 of this appropriation is for a
 2.31 grant to Hennepin County to rehabilitate the
 2.32 Franklin Avenue Bridge. This appropriation
 2.33 is not available until the commissioner of

3.1 management and budget determines that at
 3.2 least \$13,903,000 is committed to the project
 3.3 from nonstate sources.

3.4 **Subd. 3. Local Road Improvement Fund**
 3.5 **Grants** 35,000,000

3.6 For construction and reconstruction of local
 3.7 roads with statewide or regional significance
 3.8 under Minnesota Statutes, section 174.52,
 3.9 subdivision 4, or for grants to counties to
 3.10 assist in paying the costs of rural road safety
 3.11 capital improvement projects on county
 3.12 state-aid highways under Minnesota Statutes,
 3.13 section 174.52, subdivision 4a.

3.14 **Subd. 4. Rail Service Improvements** 1,000,000

3.15 This appropriation is from the general fund
 3.16 for a rail service improvement program under
 3.17 Minnesota Statutes, section 222.50.

3.18 **Subd. 5. Port Development Assistance** 500,000

3.19 For grants under Minnesota Statutes, chapter
 3.20 457A. Any improvements made with the
 3.21 proceeds of these grants must be publicly
 3.22 owned.

3.23 The Lower Minnesota River Watershed
 3.24 District is a port authority with respect to
 3.25 the Minnesota River commercial navigation
 3.26 channel.

3.27 **Subd. 6. Anoka County U.S. Highway 10 and**
 3.28 **County State-Aid Highway 83 Interchange** 8,000,000

3.29 For a grant to Anoka County for the U.S.
 3.30 Highway 10 and County State-Aid Highway
 3.31 83 (Armstrong Boulevard) project.

3.32 **Sec. 5. HUMAN SERVICES**

3.33 **Subdivision 1. Total Appropriation** **\$ 223,000**

4.1 To the commissioner of human services for
 4.2 the purposes specified in this section.

4.3 Subd. 2. **Remembering With Dignity** 223,000

4.4 For grave markers or memorial monuments
 4.5 for unmarked graves on public land of
 4.6 deceased residents of state hospitals or
 4.7 regional treatment centers.

4.8 Sec. 6. **EMPLOYMENT AND ECONOMIC**
 4.9 **DEVELOPMENT**

4.10 Subdivision 1. **Total Appropriation** \$ 950,000

4.11 To the commissioner of employment and
 4.12 economic development for the purposes
 4.13 specified in this section.

4.14 Subd. 2. **Hermantown; Regional Health and**
 4.15 **Wellness Center** 250,000

4.16 For a grant to the city of Hermantown
 4.17 to study, plan, and predesign a health
 4.18 and wellness center to meet the needs of
 4.19 the multigenerational population in the
 4.20 region. The facility will be located on the
 4.21 Hermantown School District campus and
 4.22 may be operated in collaboration with the
 4.23 Young Men's Christian Association. This
 4.24 appropriation does not require a local match.

4.25 Subd. 3. **Sandstone - Business Park** 200,000

4.26 For a grant to the city of Sandstone to design
 4.27 and construct necessary public infrastructure
 4.28 to open a planned business park to serve a
 4.29 major tenant in Sandstone, Pine County.

4.30 Subd. 4. **St. Paul - Museum of American Art** 300,000

4.31 For a grant to the St. Paul Port Authority to
 4.32 predesign the construction of the Minnesota
 4.33 Museum of American Art to be located in
 4.34 the city of St. Paul. This appropriation

5.1 is not available until the commissioner of
 5.2 management and budget has determined that
 5.3 at least an equal amount has been committed
 5.4 to the project from nonstate sources.

5.5 **Subd. 5. St. Paul - Park Square Theatre** 200,000

5.6 For a grant to the city of St. Paul to design,
 5.7 construct, furnish, and equip an expansion
 5.8 of the Park Square Theatre in the Hamm
 5.9 Building in St. Paul, subject to Minnesota
 5.10 Statutes, section 16A.695. This appropriation
 5.11 is not available until the commissioner of
 5.12 management and budget determines that
 5.13 a sufficient amount of nonstate funds to
 5.14 complete the project has been committed.

5.15 **Subd. 6. City of Oslo** 275,000

5.16 Of this appropriation, \$200,000 is for a grant
 5.17 to the city of Oslo for a water infrastructure
 5.18 study and \$75,000 is for a grant to the Middle
 5.19 Snake Tamarac Watershed District for a Red
 5.20 River of the North floodway hydraulic study
 5.21 for the Oslo area.

5.22 **Sec. 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

5.23 This act is effective the day following final enactment.
