1.7	Subd. 10. Online and Digital Learning Advisory Council. (a) An Online and
1.8	<u>Digital</u> Learning Advisory Council is established. The term for each council member shall
1.9	be three years. The advisory council is composed of 12 14 members from throughout the
1.10	state who have demonstrated experience with or interest in online learning. Two members
1.11	of the council must represent technology business. The remaining membership must
1.12	represent the following interests:
1.13	(1) superintendents;
1.14	(2) special education specialists;
1.15	(3) technology directors;
1.16	(4) teachers;
1.17	(5) rural, urban, and suburban school districts;
1.18	(6) supplemental programs;
1.19	(7) full-time programs;
