examination and road test <u>for either two-wheeled or three-wheeled vehicles</u> administered by the Department of Public Safety for the endorsement, and (3) in the case of applicants under 18 years of age, presents a certificate or other evidence of having successfully completed an approved two-wheeled <u>or three-wheeled vehicle</u> driver's safety course in this or another state, in accordance with rules adopted by the commissioner of public safety for courses offered by a public, private, or commercial school or institute. The commissioner of public safety may waive the road test for any applicant on determining that the applicant possesses a valid license to operate a two-wheeled <u>or three-wheeled vehicle</u> issued by a jurisdiction that requires a comparable road test for license issuance.

- (c) The commissioner of public safety shall issue a two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle instruction permit to any person over 16 years of age who (1) is in possession of a valid driver's license, (2) is enrolled in an approved two-wheeled or three-wheeled vehicle driver's safety course, and (3) has passed a written examination for the permit and paid a fee prescribed by the commissioner of public safety. A two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle instruction permit is effective for one year and may be renewed under rules prescribed by the commissioner of public safety.
- 2.17 (d) No person who is operating by virtue of a two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle instruction permit shall:
  - (1) carry any passengers on the streets and highways of this state on the motorcycle while the person is operating the motorcycle;
  - (2) drive the motorcycle at night; or
  - (3) drive the motorcycle without wearing protective headgear that complies with standards established by the commissioner of public safety.
    - (e) Notwithstanding paragraphs (a) to (d), the commissioner of public safety may issue a special motorcycle permit, restricted or qualified as the commissioner of public safety deems proper, to any person demonstrating a need for the permit and unable to qualify for a driver's license.

- Subd. 2a. Two-wheeled vehicle Motorcycle endorsement fee. (a) The fee for any duplicate driver's license obtained for the purpose of adding a two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle endorsement is increased by \$18.50 for each first such duplicate license and \$13 for each renewal thereof. The additional fee must be paid into the state treasury and credited as follows:

- (1) \$11 of the additional fee for each first duplicate license, and \$7 of the additional fee
  for each renewal, must be credited to the motorcycle safety fund, which is hereby created;
  and

- (b) All application forms prepared by the commissioner for two-wheeled vehicle
   motorcycle endorsements must clearly state the amount of the total fee that is dedicated to
   the motorcycle safety fund.

## 7410.4880 SKILLS TEST FOR MOTORIZED BICYCLE OR THREE-WHEEL MOTORCYCLE.

Subp. 2. **Required for three-wheel motorcycle restriction.** The skills test must also be used for applicants testing to add a three-wheeled motorcycle restriction to a Minnesota driver's license.
