Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 175.45, subdivision 1, is amended to read: 1.6

Subdivision 1. **Duties**; goal. The commissioner of labor and industry shall convene industry representatives, identify occupational competency standards, and provide technical assistance to develop dual-training programs. The competency standards shall be identified for employment in occupations in advanced manufacturing, health care services, information technology, and agriculture, and other high-demand, high-wage occupation areas identified by the commissioner of labor and industry as authorized by law. Competency standards are not rules and are exempt from the rulemaking provisions of chapter 14, and the provisions in section 14.386 concerning exempt rules do not apply.

Sec. 2. AUTHORIZATION TO EXPAND STANDARDS FOR DUAL TRAINING.

Subdivision 1. Authorization. The commissioner of labor and industry may identify up to two additional occupation areas eligible for development of dual-training programs under Minnesota Statutes, section 175.45.
