Section 1. **DIRECTION TO COMMISSIONER; CHILD CARE TRAINING**

(a) The commissioner of human services shall develop an annual refresher course for
- 1.8

child care providers who previously completed the training requirements under Minnesota
- 1.9

Statutes, chapter 245A. This training course must incorporate training on: (1) reducing the
- 1.10

risk of sudden unexpected infant death; (2) abusive head trauma from shaking infants and
- 1.11

young children; (3) active supervision; and (4) any training required by the child care
- 1.12

development block grant. This training course shall not exceed two hours. A provider must
- 1.13

have the option to complete this training course online through self-study.

(b) The commissioner must propose any necessary legislative changes to develop and

implement the training course in paragraph (a) and to eliminate duplicative training

requirements for the 2020 legislative session.
