1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. [119C.01] DEPARTMENT OF EARLY CARE AND EDUCATION.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Establishment. The Department of Early Care and Education is
1.7	established.
1.8	Subd. 2. Purpose. The purpose in creating the department is to ensure that every child
1.9	through the age of five receives a fair and full opportunity to reach their full potential by:
1.10	(1) consolidating and coordinating resources and public funding streams for early
1.11	education and care in order to ensure the sound and coordinated development of all early
1.12	education and care services available to children in Minnesota;
1.13	(2) increasing the state's capacity to support school districts in their effort to improve
1.14	academic performance of at-risk children;
1.15	(3) increasing the state's capacity to serve low-income children and lowering the rate of
1.16	children entering kindergarten not fully prepared;
1.17	(4) working in collaboration with school districts to ensure comprehensive and
1.18	developmentally appropriate assessments, where applicable;
1.19	(5) ensuring effective kindergarten transitions;

- 2.13 <u>administered by local, state, and federal agencies, with local points of entry;</u>
- 2.14 (12) developing and managing an effective data collection system to support the necessary
- 2.15 <u>functions of a coordinated system of early education and care in order to enable accurate</u>
- 2.16 evaluation of its impact;
- 2.17 (13) respecting and drawing upon family values and cultural heritage; and
- 2.18 (14) establishing the administrative framework for, and promoting the development of,
- 2.19 early education and care services in order to ensure that such services, staffed by

- 2.23 Sec. 2. [119C.02] DEFINITIONS.
- 2.24 Subdivision 1. Application. The definitions in this section apply to this chapter.
- 2.25 <u>Subd. 2.</u> Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the commissioner of early care and
  2.26 education.
- 2.27 Subd. 3. Department. "Department" means the Department of Early Care and Education.
   2.28 EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective July 1, 2019.

3.1	Sec. 3. [119C.03] COMMISSIONER.
3.2	Subdivision 1. General. The department is under the administrative control of the
3.3	commissioner. The commissioner is appointed by the governor with the advice and consent
3.4	of the senate. The commissioner must possess broad knowledge and experience in early
3.5	care and education. The commissioner has the general powers as provided in section 15.06,
3.6	subdivision 6. The commissioner's salary must be established according to the procedure
3.7	in section 15A.0815, subdivision 5, in the same range as that specified for the commissioner
3.8	of management and budget.
3.9	Subd. 2. Duties of the commissioner. (a) The commissioner shall apply for, and accept
3.10	on behalf of the state, any federal, local, or private grants, bequests, gifts, or contributions
3.11	to aid in the financing of any of the programs or policies of the department.
3.12	(b) The commissioner shall report biennially, starting January 15, 2021, to the committees
3.13	of the legislature having jurisdiction over early care and education programs. The report
3.14	must describe the department's progress in achieving the goals and implementing the
3.15	programs authorized under this chapter. The report must evaluate the progress of the state
3.16	of Minnesota in moving toward a system of universal early education and care for preschool
3.17	children through the age of five and include the department's budget request for the next
3.18	biennium.
3.19	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective July 1, 2019.
3.20	Sec. 4. [119C.04] TRANSFERS FROM OTHER AGENCIES.
3.21	Subdivision 1. General. Beginning on November 1, 2019, the Departments of Health,
3.22	Human Services, and Education must begin to transition all of the functions and powers
3.23	held by these departments in areas related to regulation and licensure of early care and
3.24	education programs to the department.
3.25	Subd. 2. Department of Human Services. The powers and duties of the Department
3.26	of Human Services with respect to the following programs are transferred to the Department
3.27	of Early Care and Education under section 15.039:
3.28	(1) the child care programs under sections 119B.011 to 119B.16;
