1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. LIBRARY MEDIA SPECIALIST GRANT PROGRAM.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For purposes of this section, the following terms have
1.7	the meanings given them.
1.8	(b) "Library media specialist" means an individual licensed in Minnesota under Minnesota
1.9	Rules, part 8710.4550, or a person actively seeking that license.
1.10	(c) "New position" means a library media specialist full-time or part-time position not
1.11	under contract by a school at the start of the 2018-2019 school year.
1.12	Subd. 2. Purpose. The library media specialist grant program is designed to:
1.13	(1) address shortages of library media specialists within Minnesota schools; and
1.14	(2) ensure that students receive effective academic support and integrated and
1.15	comprehensive services to improve prekindergarten through grade 12 school outcomes and
1.16	career and college readiness.
1.17	Subd. 3. Grant eligibility and application. (a) A school district, charter school, or tribal
1.18	contract school is eligible to apply for a six-year matching grant under this section.
1.19	(b) The commissioner of education must specify the form and manner of the grant
1.20	application. In awarding grants, the commissioner must give priority to schools in which
1.21	library media specialist positions do not currently exist. To the extent practicable, the
