1.7	Subdivision 1. Identifying and listing. (a) By January 1, 2021, the Board of Water and
1.8	Soil Resources must:
1.9	(1) identify materials used in conservation and bioengineering projects that contain
1.10	plastic that are used or are likely to be used in state-funded projects;
1.11	(2) determine whether feasible alternatives for the materials identified are available that
1.12	do not contain plastic; and
1.13	(3) post a list of the materials with feasible alternatives prominently on the board's
1.14	website stating that the materials are ineligible for state funding beginning January 1, 2023.
1.15	(b) The criteria for identifying and listing materials under this subdivision are not subject
1.16	to the rulemaking provisions of chapter 14, and section 14.386 does not apply.
1.17	Subd. 2. Prohibition. Beginning January 1, 2023, a person may not:
1.18	(1) purchase a material listed under subdivision 1, in whole or in part, with state funds;
