9.4 Sec. 64. MEMORIAL COMMEMORATING RECIPIENTS OF THE MEDAL OF 9.5 HONOR.

9.6 Subdivision 1. Medal of Honor Memorial on the State Capitol grounds. Subject to
9.7 approval by the Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board, the commissioner of
9.8 administration shall place a memorial on the State Capitol grounds to honor Minnesotans
9.9 awarded the Medal of Honor.

Subd. 2. Gifts and grants. The commissioner of veterans affairs may solicit gifts, grants, 9.10 or donations of any kind from any private or public source to carry out the purposes of this 9.11 section. A Medal of Honor Memorial account is created in the special revenue fund. The 9.12 account consists of money transferred by law to the account and any other money donated, 9.13 gifted, granted, allotted, or otherwise provided to the account. All gifts, grants, or donations 9.14 received by the commissioner shall be deposited in a Medal of Honor Memorial account in 9.15 the special revenue fund. Money in the account is annually appropriated to the commissioner 9.16 of administration for predesign, design, construction, and ongoing maintenance of the 9.17 memorial. 9.18

9.19 Subd. 3. Restrictions. Money deposited in the Medal of Honor Memorial account is not
9.20 available until the commissioner of management and budget has determined an amount
9.21 sufficient to complete predesign of the memorial has been committed to the project from
9.22 nonstate sources. The commissioner of administration shall not begin construction on this
9.23 project until money in the account is sufficient to pay for all costs related to construction
9.24 and ongoing maintenance of the memorial.

9.25 Sec. 6. PLAQUE.

9.26 <u>Subdivision 1.</u> Purpose. The state wishes to honor all Minnesota veterans who have
9.27 <u>honorably and bravely served in the United States armed forces, both at home and abroad,</u>
9.28 <u>during World War I.</u>

9.29 Subd. 2. Plaque authorized. The commissioner of administration shall place a memorial
9.30 plaque in the court of honor on the Capitol grounds to recognize the valiant service of

- 9.31 Minnesota veterans who have honorably and bravely served in the United States armed
- 9.32 forces, both at home and abroad, during World War I. This plaque will replace the current

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- 10.1 plaque honoring veterans who served abroad during World War I. The Capitol Area
- 10.2 Architectural and Planning Board shall solicit design submissions from the public. Each
- 10.3 design submission must include a commitment to furnish the plaque at no cost to the state.
- 10.4 The Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board shall select a design from those submitted
- 10.5 to use as a basis for final production. The selected design must be approved by the
- 10.6 commissioner of veterans affairs and must be furnished by the person or group who submitted
- 10.7 <u>the design at no cost to the state.</u>
- 10.8 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
