A bill for an act 1.1 relating to public safety; requiring certain bus operators to make certain disclosures 12 to employers and possess proof of physical qualifications to operate school buses; 1.3 amending Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.02, subdivisions 2a, 2b. 1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA: 1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.02, subdivision 2a, is amended to read: 1.6 Subd. 2a. Exception for certain school bus drivers. Notwithstanding subdivision 2, 1.7 paragraph (b), the holder of a class D driver's license, without a school bus endorsement, 1.8 may operate a type A school bus or a multifunction school activity bus under the following 1.9 conditions: 1.10 (a) The operator is an employee of the entity that owns, leases, or contracts for the school 1.11 bus and is not solely hired to provide transportation services under this subdivision. 1.12 (b) The operator drives the school bus only from points of origin to points of destination, 1.13 not including home-to-school trips to pick up or drop off students. 1.14 (c) The operator is prohibited from using the eight-light system. Violation of this 1.15 paragraph is a misdemeanor. 1.16 (d) The operator's employer has adopted and implemented a policy that provides for 1.17 annual training and certification of the operator in: 1.18 (1) safe operation of the type of school bus the operator will be driving; 1.19 (2) understanding student behavior, including issues relating to students with disabilities; 1.20

or ordinance of another state is precluded from operating a school bus for five years from
the date of conviction.
