1.10	Subd. 2. Closing the literacy gap. (a) For a grant to the Literacy Matters Foundation
1.11	for activities designed to close the literacy gap through teacher support and improving
1.12	reading proficiency for students of color:
1.13	<u>\$ 500,000 2021</u>
1.14	(b) The Literacy Matters Foundation must use the funds appropriated in this section to
1.15	support classroom teachers in public schools where students are performing below the
1.16	statewide average reading achievement levels. Funds must be used for programs providing
1.17	individualized learning experiences for students using multisensory technology in building
1.18	memory of foundational reading, writing, and spelling skills. The foundation must also
1.19	provide geographic diversity when choosing schools for its programming.
1.20	(c) To the extent practicable, the Literacy Matters Foundation's grant-funded activities
1.21	must be focused on programs for underserved students and students of color and American
1.22	Indian students in kindergarten through third grade.

- 2.2 <u>a report to the education committees of the legislature describing the programs offered,</u>
