1.6	Section 1. TRIBAL ADVOCACY COUNCIL ON ENERGY; DEPARTMENT OF
1.7	COMMERCE SUPPORT.
1.8	(a) The Department of Commerce must provide technical support and subject matter
1.9	expertise to assist and help facilitate any efforts taken by the 11 federally recognized Indian
1.10	tribes in Minnesota to establish a tribal advocacy council on energy.
1.11	(b) When providing support to a tribal advocacy council on energy, the Department of
1.12	Commerce must assist the council:
1.13	(1) assess and evaluate common tribal energy issues, including (i) identifying and
1.14	prioritizing energy issues, (ii) facilitating idea sharing between the tribes to generate solutions
1.15	to energy issues, and (iii) assisting decision making with respect to resolving energy issues;
1.16	(2) develop new statewide energy policies or proposed legislation, including (i) organizing
1.17	stakeholder meetings, (ii) gathering input and other relevant information, (iii) assisting with
1.18	policy proposal development, evaluation, and decision making, and (iv) helping facilitate
1.19	actions taken to submit, and obtain approval for or have enacted, policies or legislation
