1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. FAMILY LAW MEDIATION TASK FORCE.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Establishment. The Family Law Mediation Task Force is established
1.7	(1) to advise and inform the legislature on the impact of conflict on children during the
1.8	marital dissolution process and the process to establish paternity and (2) to make conflict
1.9	resolution recommendations to reduce that conflict.
1.10	Subd. 2. Membership. (a) The task force consists of 16 members as follows:
1.11	(1) two members of the house of representatives, one appointed by the speaker of the
1.12	house and one appointed by the minority leader;
1.13	(2) two members of the senate, one appointed by the majority leader and one appointed
1.14	by the minority leader;
1.15	(3) one representative from the Family Law Section of the Minnesota State Bar
1.16	Association;
1.17	(4) one representative from the Alternative Dispute Resolution Section of the Minnesota
1.18	State Bar Association;
1.19	(5) one representative from the Academy of Professional Family Mediators;
1.20	(6) one representative from the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts, Minnesota

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3.1	Subd. 6. Report. The task force must submit the report required under subdivision 5 to
3.2	the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction
3.3	over family law by January 31, 2020. The report must include the analysis and
3.4	recommendations required under subdivision 5 and any draft legislation necessary to
3.5	implement the recommendations.
3.6	Subd. 7. Open meetings. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the task force is
3.7	subject to Minnesota Statutes, chapter 13D. A meeting of the task force occurs when a
3.8	quorum is present and the members receive information, discuss, or take action on any
3.9	matter relating to the duties of the task force. The task force may conduct meetings as
3.10	provided in Minnesota Statutes, section 13D.015 or 13D.02. The task force may conduct
3.11	meetings at any location in the state that is appropriate for the purposes of the task force as
3.12	long as the location is open and accessible to the public. For legislative members of the task
3.13	force, enforcement of this subdivision is governed by Minnesota Statutes, section 3.055,
3.14	subdivision 2. For nonlegislative members of the task force, enforcement of this subdivision
3.15	is governed by Minnesota Statutes, section 13D.06, subdivisions 1 and 2.
3.16	Subd. 8. Expiration. The task force expires upon submission of the report required
3.17	under subdivision 6.

3.18 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
