1.7	Section 1. [211B.075] ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATIONS DISTRIBUTED BY
1.8	COMMITTEES AND PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS.
1.9	(a) Any mailing sent by or on behalf of a committee or other private organization that
1.10	includes an absentee ballot application or a sample ballot designed to encourage voting at
1.11	an election must include the applicable set of statements, printed in capital letters on the
1.12	outside of the mailing so that the statements are clearly visible at the time of opening, as
1.13	follows:
1.14	(1) if an absentee ballot application is enclosed:
1.15	(i) "THIS IS AN ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATION, NOT AN OFFICIAL
1.16	BALLOT"; and
1.17	(ii) "THIS IS NOT AN OFFICIAL COMMUNICATION FROM A UNIT OF
1.18	GOVERNMENT"; and
1.19	(2) if a sample ballot is enclosed:
1.20	(i) "THIS IS A SAMPLE BALLOT, NOT AN OFFICIAL BALLOT"; and
1.21	(ii) "THIS IS NOT AN OFFICIAL COMMUNICATION FROM A UNIT OF
1.22	GOVERNMENT.

(b) As used in this subdivision, "sample ballot" means a document enclosed in the mailing
that is formatted and printed in a manner that would lead a reasonable person to believe the
document is an official ballot. A document that contains the names of particular candidates
or ballot questions alongside illustrations of a generic ballot or common ballot markings is
not a sample ballot for purposes of this subdivision, so long as the format and style of the
document would not lead a reasonable person to mistake it for an official ballot.
