1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 609.2241, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 2. Crime. (a) It is a crime, which may be prosecuted under section 609.17, 609.185,
1.8	609.19, 609.221, 609.222, 609.223, 609.2231, or 609.224, for a person who knowingly
1.9	harbors an infectious agent, other than human immunodeficiency virus, to transfer this agent
1.10	to another person, if the crime involved:
1.11	(1) sexual penetration with another person without having first informed the other person
1.12	that the person has a communicable disease;
1.13	(2) transfer of blood, sperm, organs, or tissue, except as deemed necessary for medical
1.14	research or if disclosed on donor screening forms; or
1.15	(3) sharing of nonsterile syringes or needles for the purpose of injecting drugs.
1.16	(b) It is a crime for a person who knowingly harbors the human immunodeficiency virus
1.17	to intentionally transfer the virus to the body of another person by using a mode of
1.18	transmission under paragraph (a), clauses (1) to (3).
1.19	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective August 1, 2022, and applies to crimes
