relating to transportation; authorizing collection of race and ethnicity data on applications for drivers' licenses and identification cards; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 13.69, subdivision 1; Minnesota Statutes 2021 Supplement, section 171.06, subdivision 3.
