1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 256B.439, subdivision 3c, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 3c. Contact and demographic information for consumer surveys for home
1.8	and community-based services. For purposes of conducting the consumer surveys under
1.9	subdivision 3a, the commissioner may request contact information of clients and associated
1.10	key representatives and aggregate, de-identified demographic information of clients served
1.11	by the provider. The commissioner may request the following demographic information:
1.12	(1) age; (2) race; (3) ethnicity; and (4) gender identity. Providers must furnish the contact
1.13	and demographic information available to the provider and must provide notice to clients
1.14	and associated key representatives that their contact information and aggregate demographic
1.15	information has been provided to the commissioner.
1.16	Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 256B.439, subdivision 3d, is amended to read:
1.17	Subd. 3d. Resident experience survey and family survey for assisted living
1.18	facilities. The commissioner shall develop and administer a resident experience survey for
1.19	assisted living facility residents and a family survey for families of assisted living facility
1.20	residents. Money appropriated to the commissioner to administer the resident experience
1.21	survey and family survey is available in either fiscal year of the biennium in which it is
1.22	appropriated. Assisted living facilities licensed under chapter 144G must participate in the
1.23	surveys when the commissioner requests their participation.

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
