1.7	Section 1. [16C.37] CONTRACTS FOR INTERNET SERVICE; ADHERENCE TO
1.8	NET NEUTRALITY.
1.9	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For purposes of this section, the following terms have
1.10	the meanings given in this subdivision.
1.11	(b) "Broadband Internet access service" means:
1.12	(1) a mass-market retail service by wire or radio that provides the capability to transmit
1.13	data to and receive data from all or substantially all Internet endpoints, including any
1.14	capabilities that are incidental to or enable the operation of the communications service;
1.15	(2) any service that provides a functional equivalent of the service described in clause
1.16	<u>(1); or</u>
1.17	(3) any service that is used to evade the protections set forth in this section.
1.18	Broadband Internet access service includes a service that serves end users at fixed endpoints
1.19	using stationary equipment or end users using mobile stations, but does not include dial-up
1.20	Internet access service.

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2.1	(c) "Edge provider" means any person or entity that provides (1) any content, application,
2.2	or service over the Internet, or (2) a device used for accessing any content, application, or

2.4	(d) "Internet service provider" means a business that provides broadband Internet access

2.6	(e) "Paid prioritization" means the management of an Internet service provider's network
2.7	to directly or indirectly favor some traffic over other traffic in exchange for monetary
2.8	compensation from a third party, other consideration from a third party, or to benefit an
2.9	affiliated entity.
2.10	Subd. 2. Purchasing or funding broadband Internet access services; prohibitions.
2.11	A state agency or political subdivision is prohibited from entering into a contract or providing
2.12	funding for the purchase of broadband Internet access service that does not contain:
2.13	(1) a binding agreement in which the Internet service provider certifies, under penalty
2.14	of perjury, that the Internet service provider will not engage in any of the following activities with respect to any of its Minnesota customers:
2.15	with respect to any or its winnesota customers.
2.16	(i) block lawful content, applications, services, or nonharmful devices, subject to
2.17	reasonable network management;
2.18	(ii) impair, impede, or degrade lawful Internet traffic on the basis of (A) Internet content,
2.19	application, or service, or (B) use of a nonharmful device, subject to reasonable network

2.21	(iii) engage in paid prioritization;
2.22	(iv) unreasonably interfere with or unreasonably disadvantage:

section 60	9.48. The venue for enforcement proceedings is Ramsey County.
