Re: Annual Report on Obsolete, Unnecessary or Duplicative Rules

Dear Ms. Timmons:

As required by Minnesota Statutes §14.05, Subdivision 5, the following is the Annual Report of the Minnesota State Lottery on Obsolete, Unnecessary or Duplicative Rules. This statute requires each agency to submit a list of any rules or portion of rules that are obsolete, unnecessary or duplicative of other state or federal statutes or rules to the Governor, the legislative coordinating commission, the policy and funding committees and divisions with jurisdiction over the agency and the Revisor of Statutes. The report must either report a timetable for repeal of the rule or portion of the rule or must develop a bill for submission to the appropriate policy committee to repeal the obsolete, unnecessary or duplicative rules.

At this time, the Minnesota State Lottery has identified the following rules that are obsolete, unnecessary or duplicative that should be repealed:

1. Minnesota Rules, Chapter 7856, Part 7856.1000, Subpart 3.
2. Minnesota Rules, Chapter 7857, Part 7857.3000, Subpart 3 (the last phrase in the first sentence).
3. Minnesota Rules, Chapter 7857, Part 7857.6010.

Minnesota Rule 7856.1000, Subpart 3, is obsolete since it provides a definition of "board" as meaning the Minnesota State Lottery Board and the Minnesota State Lottery Board has been eliminated by the legislature. Minnesota Rule 7857.3000, Subpart 3, is partially obsolete to the extent that this rule permits a person 18 years old or older to purchase a ticket for the purpose of making a gift to a person under 18 years of age since Minnesota Statutes §349A.12, Subdivision 5, was amended to prohibit a person from giving a lottery ticket to a person under the age of 18. Minnesota Rule 7857.6010 is obsolete since it sets forth procedures for the payment of prizes to persons under 18 years of age while Minnesota Statutes §349A.12, Subdivisions 1 and 2, was amended to prohibit a person under the age of 18 from receiving a prize from the Lottery and prohibits the payment of a lottery prize to a person under 18.


